



#### Pastor's Report - 2023

"In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth" is how the bible starts in Genesis. "An account of the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah," is how Matthew starts his Gospel. Mark starts rather simply, "The beginning of the good news." Luke is more introspective, "Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us." And everyone recognizes John, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God." To the present my last reports started, "It has been a full year in more ways than one," and "It sure has been an interesting year."

Those introductions show excitement, energy and anticipation and I think that, not to overstate it, is what our year at St. James has been. Many new and returning events have happened. We had our first homecoming with over 80 people coming. The oyster dinner was revitalized with over 90 dinners served. We had a new roof put on the Sunday School annex. We built a new pavilion where we held worship. We cleared the brush from the Southwest side of the property. Our Men's Group meets weekly to study the lessons for the following Sunday. The Men's Group also prepared and served a delicious breakfast for all on Easter morning. The Women's Open Circle has grown and was instrumental in organizing many of these events.

Worship has been energized. We are averaging close to 30 people every Sunday. The Choir has an anthem on Sundays. With the new pavilion, our worship outside has developed. Lunch and Fellowship after church has been well attended. Hannah Pingel livens our worship and Pastor Carl has blessed us with his guitar and trumpet.

I have made 65 home visits, seven hospital visits, led 34 services, preparing bulletins for every service during the year. Our average weekly attendance for worship is 25. We have had 12 newsletters this year. At present we have five members who I take communion to every month. There are also times when members are not able to come to church for a few weeks that I visit and take communion. I officiated for two funerals this year.

Having Pastor Carl leading worship and preaching half the time has been a great help and his insights and wisdom are a gift to us. It would be hard to name all who helped and made all of this happen, well I can say, everyone at St. James has actively participated in all parts of our community. You will see that as you read the rest of the reports.

#### **Property Committee Report - 2023**

The St. James Property Committee is very pleased to report a successful year in not only maintaining, but also improving the church property. The Committee has completed actions on tasks as major as replacing the schoolhouse roof to as minor as replacing a light bulb.

The year began with a structural and grounds inspection of the church property. The noted discrepancies were prioritized and assigned to Committee members for action. Other discrepancies noted subsequent to the initial inspection were dealt with in the same manner. Many of the noted outdoor discrepancies are pending action due to the weather, but it is anticipated these discrepancies will be resolved in the coming year, 2024.

The following are some of the 2023 action items completed by Property Committee Members and congregation volunteers:

- -replaced all fire extinguishers
- -installed carbon monoxide detector in Fellowship Hall
- -installed wooden railing and post caps around pavilion
- -installed metal hand railing leading to the pavilion
- -repaired mortar on church entryway bricks
- -contracted schoolhouse roof replacement
- -contracted removal of large dead trees that presented a safety hazard
- -installed LED lighting in Fellowship Hall serving area
- -contracted brush removal from southside of church property
- -cleared residual brush cuttings from contracted brush cutting
- -contracted fall leaf removal
- -removed timeworn playground equipment that presented a child safety hazard

Looking ahead in 2024, the Property Committee has the following items on the agenda:

- responsibilities for ongoing deep and routine cleaning of the church
- painting outside and inside
- -exterior door locks
- -outside lighting near entries and steps
- -inside church sanctuary lighting

Property Committee Members (Joyce Dull, Debbie Synder, Cindy Wright, Winston Whitecotton) and congregation volunteers are to be commended for all their generous time and efforts in making 2023 a successful year for this committee.

#### Social Ministry Report - 2023

The Social Ministry Team is alive and well at St. James.

In the spring, we helped a family in need with medical expenses of \$1,000. \$310 was used for the purchase of food for the Homecoming event in August. We also collected \$357 of In-Kind food donations for Homecoming. In the fall, we made a financial contribution of \$250 to the Rise Against Hunger Program.

We continue to support the BackPacks Program through the purchase of food. On average, we provide weekend meals to 19 kids throughout the school year. Thanks to everyone for your food and monetary donations.

Our annual Oyster Supper / Cake Auction was held on November 17<sup>th</sup>. We served 90+ guests, including take-outs. Our net profit was \$2,025. June found us back outdoors under the oaks for our services. We worshipped at Barren Ridge Vineyard on Sunday July 9<sup>th</sup>.

We held Homecoming at St. James on August 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> with a Vesper Service on Saturday night and a worship service on Sunday morning using our lovely new pavilion.

Advent services were shared jointly with Grace, Bethlehem, and Zion. St. James used the Holden Prayer Service – a first for us.

The church was decorated on Sunday December 10<sup>th</sup> after enjoying a soup and sandwich lunch.

Christmas services were held on Sunday, Christmas Eve. An 11:00am Advent Service and a 7:00pm Candlelight Service, both with communion.

The choir provided a Christmas Program, "There's a Song in the Air", on Sunday January 14, 2024. Thank you, Debbie, for planning and putting together our program. It was a success!

#### **Open Circle Report - 2023**

Preparation for our Homecoming on August 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> was our primary focus for the year. However, there were many more opportunities for service and fellowship; and we took advantage of them all!

We supported six local charities – WARM, Valley Mission, Verona Food Pantry, SACRA, Western State Hospital, and the BackPacks Program - by sponsoring Soup & Sandwich luncheons in the winter months and Salad Luncheons in the summer. The goodwill offerings totaled \$784. Thanks to all for your generosity!

Betty Bartley continues to manage our card ministry. Monthly and special occasion cards are sent to our shut-ins.

Joyce Dull's dedication to the BackPacks Program remains strong. The number of kids that we support through the BackPacks Program has averaged 19.

Cindy Wright created lovely teacup floral arrangements that were delivered to our shut ins at Easter. Anne Putnam created fruit baskets that were delivered for Christmas.

During our church-wide declutter day, we discovered multiple containers of socks that were painted pre-COVID days and intended for Hospice patients. Hospice no longer had a need. Sherie Whiting-Rohal found happy homes for the socks with WARM, Valley Mission, and Embrace.

We collected 106 assorted size batteries, 1 first aid kit, 8 flashlights, 3 laundry baskets, 8 night lights, and 18 washcloths for the Central Valley Habitat for Humanity.

In July we began writing an article about the monthly activities of our Open Circle for inclusion in the St. James Newsletter.

We re-established the tradition of ThankOfferings. In November, we donated \$128.94 to Katie's Fund.

Also in November, we re-established a Quilt Group, spurred on by our recent SVWO Fall Gathering (see below). In addition to a planning meeting, we had two work sessions with six ladies in attendance each time. Our plans for the quilts include Micah Ministries and Habitat for Humanity.

We ended the year with our last meeting on December 5<sup>th</sup> at the Home Town Grill. 13 ladies enjoyed good food, fun, and fellowship – a great way to end the year!

Now back to Homecoming 2023! So much love went into the planning and preparation of this event. We developed an ever-growing list of invitees, mailed save the date cards & invitations, developed the menu and prepared the food (thanks go to Joyce and her team), created activities – the Timeline, a St. James/Zion Photo, trivia, & scrapbooks, we created name tags and programs, we arranged for valet parking, and we cleaned (and cleaned and cleaned), etc. We also contributed \$525+ to help cover expenses. And, we had help from others along the way – many thanks to everyone.

In the end, 88 people joined us on the evening of August 5<sup>th</sup> and 38 attended on Sunday morning for worship.

A Spring Bible Study: "Weave Us Together" (1 Corinthians 12:12-14) was held on May 9<sup>th</sup> at Salem Lutheran Church. Cindy, Bambi, Sherie, Betty, Flora, and Anne attended. The Bible Study was led by our own Pastor Gordon.

A special event – the showing of the Sight & Sound Theatres movie *Noah* was shown at The Sipe Center in Bridgewater on August 12<sup>th</sup>. Bambi, Joyce, Anne, and Pastor Gordon attended.

Our Fall Gathering was held on October 8<sup>th</sup> at Muhlenberg Lutheran Church. In keeping with our VSWO theme, "Weave Us Together", we enjoyed a presentation about the "Quilts in the Shenandoah Valley" by Alicia Thomas, Director of the Virginia Quilt Museum. Bambi, Cindy Flora, and her friend Marie, Sherie, and Anne attended. (Thus, the need to establish a quilt group was born.)

#### Virginia Synodical Women's Organization (VSWO):

The 2023 Conference was held at Roanoke College in Salem on July 21st & 22nd. Anne attended, delivering the 35 "Warren" bears made by Sherie, Flora, Bambi, and Anne along with paper towels, toilet paper, garbage bags, and deodorant donated by our group for Project Horizon. Project Horizon has been dedicated to addressing the pervasive problem of domestic and sexual violence in the Rockbridge County area since 1982.

Of particular interest were three awareness presentations.

- Reconciling in Christ churches welcoming all people, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Micah Ministries focuses on those experiencing homelessness.
- Bible Study "Weave Us Together" (1 Corinthians 12:12-14).
