

## Pastor's Musings





Council Meeting  
November 14, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

**Council Members Present:** Lynda Diehl, Joyce Dull, Ivan Diehl, Anne Putnam, Paul Rohal, and Pastor Putnam

**Council Members Absent:** Gene Giltner

**Visitors Present:** None

**Call to Order:** Ivan Diehl, Vice-President, called the meeting to order.

Pastor Gordon opened the meeting with a devotion describing clues on how to live our lives.

The **Minutes** for the October 10<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting were presented. A motion was made by Lynda and seconded by Joyce to approve the minutes. The motion passed.

The **Financial Report** for October was presented. A motion was made by Paul and seconded by Joyce to accept the report. The motion passed.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Gordon reported that he recently officiated at the funeral for Patricia Jones (10/25) and Bob Dixey (11/4). He will be visiting with Eddie Jones and with Tammy & Ronnie Jones on November 15<sup>th</sup>. He reported that he continues to visit our shut-ins. Pastor Gordon also announced an Open House on 12/17. All members of the congregation are invited.

## **Correspondence:**

- Bethlehem announced a Yard Sale on 10/21/2023
- SACRA announced a Christmas Benefit Concert on 12/4/2023
- Stuarts Draft announced a Christmas Parade on 12/9/2023
- A Thank You from Lutheran Disaster Response for \$200 given by a member of St. James; \$100 was designated for the wildfire in Hawaii and \$100 was designated for the hurricane in Florida.
- A note from the VA Synod Office of the Bishop on the installation of Bishop Milton on October 21<sup>st</sup>.

## **Committee Reports:**

- **Property Committee:** Paul updated us with a thorough report of the numerous items being addressed based on priorities established by the committee.
  - With the Congregation's approval at the 10/29 meeting, the replacement of the roof covering the administration "schoolhouse" portion of the building is moving forward.
  - John D. Miller has been notified that the small memorial tree on the northeast side of the parking lot is dead and will be removed.
  - Paul and John Wright are working on the drainpipe just west of the pavilion.
  - Discussion regarding who the installer was of the floors in the Fellowship Hall and the need to have the floors commercially cleaned.
  - Discussion regarding having all of the doors re-keyed to be universal.
  - Paul made a motion to move forward with the purchase of a fire department church entry lock box, to which only the shift captain has the combination. Anne seconded the motion. The motion carried.
  - Anne made a motion that recurring expenses within the range of last year's cost can move forward without bringing it to Council. Joyce seconded the motion. The motion carried.
  - The Council commends the Property Committee for the work that is being done.
- **Stewardship & Finance:** Anne presented the draft 2024 budget from the committee to the Council.
  - Lynda made a motion to accept the 2024 budget as presented by the Stewardship & Finance Committee. Paul seconded the motion. The motion carried.
  - A Congregational Meeting will be called on 12/3 to approve the budget. Pastor Gordon will email this information, along with a copy of the budget.
- **Social Ministry & Evangelism:** Joyce reported that there are 17 children in the BackPacks Program. Food and monetary donations are used to fill the backpacks. \$330 to \$350 is needed every two weeks to meet this need. Thanks to all who regularly support this ministry.
  - Response to the Oyster Dinner has been overwhelming and people have been turned away. We are preparing for approximately 85 guests.
- **Worship, Music, & Altar:** A Cantata is being planned for 12/31 or 1/7.

- Constitution and By-Laws Committee: No report.

### **Unfinished Business:**

- Secure the building and make sure the lights are turned off on Sundays after church.
  - November = Anne
  - December = Lynda
- A list of items currently maintained in our (5x10) Safe Deposit Box at DuPont Community Credit Union was obtained. Both Rebecca Dick and Ellen McDonald, as current keyholders, have asked to be relieved of this responsibility.
  - Paul made a motion to remove Rebecca Dick and Ellen McDonald as keyholders on the account and replace with Deborah Snyder and Anne Putnam. John Wright will remain on the account as a non-keyholder. Joyce seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Rebecca Dick has also requested to be removed from her responsibilities as a signer on the checking/savings account.
  - Joyce made a motion to remove Rebecca Dick as a signer on account #594846 and add Deborah Snyder to the account in her role as Financial Secretary and to be afforded all rights and privileges of this position. Paul seconded the motion. The motion carried.

### **New Business:**

- Anne made a motion to update the Church Cleaning Agreement with Glenda & Billy Strickler to reflect the increase from \$150 per month to \$200 per month and to convert the annual agreement to an open-ended agreement, that may be terminated by either party with a minimum of two weeks' notice. Lynda seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Paul made a motion to update the Pastoral Agreement to reflect the increase from \$150 per worship service to \$200 per service and to convert the annual agreement to an open-ended agreement, that may be terminated by either party with a minimum of 30 days' notice. Lynda seconded the motion. The motion carried.

With no further business, Ivan moved to adjourn the meeting. We closed with The Lord's Prayer at 8:20 p.m.
