

## **Pastor's Musings**

Do you want to know how I prepare for a sermon? Probably not, but I will tell you anyway. I will look ahead a few weeks to see what the lessons are to begin the process. As I think about the lessons, I will decide which lesson will be the primary one I will use. Most of the time it is the Gospel. This summer the semi-continuous lessons in the Old Testament, Genesis and Exodus are the primary ones. My next thought is, how does this story relate to us, the people of St. James.

Monday morning, at least most Mondays, I have a ZOOM text study group. There we talk about the scripture for the coming week. Commentaries online and in my library give me background and reflections on the text. One online commentary that I use regularly is called "Working Preacher". It is from Luther Seminary in Minnesota. I recently purchased a commentary on Genesis to add to my library. I sometimes look online at the "Dollar Store Children Sermons" kids sermon ideas. What do you mean kids' sermons? Sometimes when you look at a scripture it is best to make it simple. I use the Men's Group on Friday and Anne to bounce ideas off of or to see if they make sense.

Sermons are creations of the preacher, coming from his or her perspective. At the Synod Assembly closing worship, a woman preached the sermon. It was an excellent sermon on the story of Hagar and Ishmael. It was much different than how I preached it. It came from a woman's perspective. I could not have preached that sermon. Preacher's experiences and biases come out in their preaching.

Here is what I hope some of my sermons may do, knowing some will not. I hope they can allow you to think about your own understandings. Even if you don't accept how I see the world, can you reflect on how you see it? Do new or different perspectives give you pause and even begin to change or support your own thinking? There is not one way to read the Bible or one way to preach it or one right answer. We live in a world of grey and that in itself can be a challenge.

#### **SYNOD NEWS**

At the Virginia Synod Assembly in June we elected a new Bishop. (See her information below.) Throughout the Assembly there were a number of interesting videos shown that highlighted the work of the Virginia Synod and the ELCA. One that was particularly interesting was the Serving Boldly Award, created by the Virginia Synod Council in October 2020. It was given to five lay leaders who embody and demonstrate a commitment to the gospel of Jesus Christ in their congregation and/or community. Nominations were received from numerous Virginia Synod congregations. The Synod recognized the 2023 recipients of the award with a video highlighting their accomplishments.

The Rev. Dr. Phyllis Blair Milton, Pastor at Holy Communion in Portsmouth Virginia, was elected June 11 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Virginia Synod. The election took place during the Virginia Synod Assembly, June 9-11, at Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia.

There was some excitement and amazement because on the normal fifth and final ballot Pastor Phyllis Milton and the Rev. Kelly Bayer Derrick, (Assistant to the Bishop of the Virginia Synod) were tied 171 to 171. It had never happened before in the ELCA and necessitated a sixth vote. On the sixth ballet Bishop-Elect Milton was chosen with 175 votes to Pastor Bayer Derrick's 172 votes.

Pastor Milton has served as Pastor at Holy Communion in Portsmouth since 2022. Prior to that, she served as Interim Associate Pastor at First Lutheran in Norfolk from March-November in 2021; Pastor and School Chaplain at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church and School in Hampton from 2013-2021; Synodical Minister for Christian Formation for the Virginia Synod from 2012-2017.

Pastor Milton earned her Bachelor of Science degree from Morgan State University in 1976, Masters degrees from Georgia State in 1980 and Bethel Seminary in 1995, and her Doctorate of Ministry in Church Leadership Development and Organizational Systems from Bethel Seminary in 2004 and completed her Lutheran Semester at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary in 2010.

Bishop-Elect Milton will be the first female bishop and first African American bishop in the history of the Virginia Synod. She will take office on September 1 and will be installed on Saturday, October 21 at First Presbyterian Church in Waynesboro.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Gordon reported on the Synod Assembly, pointing out the use of short video clips lifting up a variety of organizations and individual for their service to those in need. He will put links to the videos in the upcoming newsletter.

He reported that Hannah will be gone for the next four weeks. Pastor Carl has agreed to play his guitar in her absence.

Pastor Gordon reported that he and Anne will be on vacation from August 28<sup>th</sup> through September 16<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Carl will be leading worship the first two Sundays in September.

Zion, Bethlehem, and Grace have been invited to participate in our Barren Ridge services.

**Correspondence:** We received a flyer from Southern States Petroleum Co-Op regarding Furnace Maintenance Plans. Paul offered to take it for consideration by the Property Committee. Historically, we have not committed to a set program. Anne stated that she would provide information to Paul regarding the maintenance done last year.

#### **Unfinished Business:**
