When I graduated from college there were two directions I could go. I could be a social worker or go to seminary. I chose seminary and became a pastor. The church, the Gospel I felt has more to offer people than social work. A social worker can care for people and help them in many ways. As you know there is only so much that can be done for some people. There is an added dimension in the church, Jesus/God. When life feels hopeless there is hope. When there is no answer there is more.

As a chaplain I would evaluate patients support system. Is it a social club like Lions, VFW, etc.? Was it family or neighbors or a faith community? These are support systems that could help care for patients and families. However, the faith community family had an added dimension, Jesus/God. When life felt hopeless there was hope. When there was no answer there was more.

On the road to Emmaus the disciples felt hopeless, dejected. Jesus joined them and traveled with them. And when he broke bread with them their lives changed. When the disciples were holed up in a room with the door locked and fearful, Jesus came into their midst and said, "Peace be with you." It is in those terrible moments that God breaks into our world and gives us hope, gives us new life.

That is the extra added bonus that the church gives people. When there is no answer, no hope, God is there. We are reminded of that every week with the breaking of bread, not only at the Eucharist but also as we gather for lunch, as we greet each other, as we remember each other in our prayers.

The sadness I had as a chaplain when I met patients and families that did not understand the Gospel is that they may not have hope. They may not understand there is more to life. We see hopelessness in a lot of the world. I wish I had a way to break into that world. It is a sadness I have about my ministry, it is limited only to a few people. I then must remember when life feels hopeless there is hope. When there is no answer there is more.





Call to Order: Gene Giltner, President, called the meeting to order.

Pastor Gordon opened the meeting with a reflection on the Gospel for the Sunday after Easter and the fact this it is always the story of Doubting Thomas. He went on to explain how it was a time of high anxiety and a fear of authority was experienced by all of the Disciples, not just Thomas. Much like our own lives, we all experience times of anxiety and fear. Peace be with you.

The **Minutes** for the March 15th Council Meeting were presented. A motion was made by John and seconded by Flora to approve the minutes. The motion passed.

The **Financial Report** for March was presented. A motion was made by Joyce and seconded by Flora to accept the report. The motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Gordon reported that our Easter and Lenten services all went well. He continues to visit our shut-ins. Pastor Gordon reported that he will be on vacation from April 30th through May 3rd and again on May 5th through May 8th. He will be available by phone during these times. Pastor Gordon announced that Hannah will be in Europe from 6/17 through 7/17. He will ask Pastor Carl to play his guitar on 6/18, 7/2, and 7/16 – the Sundays which he is scheduled to preach. He will ask Pastor Karen if Bethlehem's organist would be willing to play at our Barren Ridge service on 7/9. We still need a musician for 6/25 – perhaps Pastor Carl or Betty Bartley.

Correspondence: An Easter card from Norma Turak was shared. Information was received from Shenandoah Valley Social Services regarding foster care.

Unfinished Business:

- Homecoming (8/5-6/2023) Anne reported that the pens have been received. Activities during the event will include a timeline, photos & scrapbooks, trivia, cornhole, and acknowledgements.
- Secure the building and make sure the lights are turned off.

- Pastor Gordon has obtained all but one photo. The next step is to print and frame the photos for addition to our Pastor Photo Gallery.
